Re: Income Guidelines — Lower Living Standard Income Level (LLSIL) and Poverty Guidelines

In accordance with the Workforce Innovation Opportunity Act (WIOA) State Compliance Policy Section 2.1, we are issuing income guidelines effective April 30, 2020 to assist Local Workforce Development Board staff in determining eligibility for low-income individuals.

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services published their poverty guidelines in the Federal Register on April 30, 2020. The most recent U.S. Department of Labor LLSIL figures were published in the Federal Register on April 30, 2020.
