Purpose

To announce the publication and effective date for implementation of revisions/updates made to the following policy:

ADW-030-02 WIOA Title I Services

Background

Under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), adults and dislocated workers may access career services and training services. WIOA provides for a workforce system that is universally accessible, customer centered and training that is job-driven.

Career and training services, tailored to the individual needs of jobseekers, form the backbone of the One-Stop Delivery System (OSDS). While some jobseekers may only need self-service or other basic career services like job listings, labor market information or information about other services, some jobseekers will need services that are more comprehensive and tailored to their individual career needs.

Modifications:

Under **Sec. II** General Provisions for Career Services (page-2)

Item “A” Basic Career Services was replaced in its entirety with the following:

Basic career services must be made available and, at a minimum, must include the following services consistent with allowable program activities and Federal cost principles. Some of the basic career services are considered self-service and informational only and do not require an enrollment. However, services that involve extensive staff time are considered staff-assisted career services and require enrollment in the WIOA Title I program.

Note: A table providing additional guidance, with respect to those services that trigger an individual becoming a program participant, has been incorporated to the policy.
