The meeting was called to order by Chair Commissioner Varlin Higbee at 2:00 p.m. Staff confirmed the meeting had been properly noticed and posted in accordance with the Nevada Open Meeting Law. Roll call was taken, and a quorum was present. The gavel was passed to Commissioner Varlin Higbee.

2) FIRST PUBLIC COMMENT SESSION:

Joe Sharpe, project director of Equus Workforce Solutions, provided an update on the success and the impact of the OSCC's joint Employ NV Business Hub teams are having with the employer partners, including a large hiring event at the convention center, in partnership with DETR, that offered thousands of employment opportunities and resulted in hundreds of direct job placements. Additionally, the OSCC had its first employer residency with MGM properties for two weeks generating direct employment offers to over 100 job seekers for a variety of positions with a starting wage of \$18.00 per hour.

Jack Martin, Director, Department of Juvenile Justices Services (DJJS) – DJJS and WC have discussed different perspectives for administering youth contracts moving forward. DJJS has seen a lot of collaboration at the Harbor sites, which are the five juvenile assessment centers that serve children with needs, such as mental health issues, that are outside of what their families, schools, and support networks can do. Most of these youth upon entering the workforce, have requirements for other services that are outside of Title I and Title II funded programs. These youth need these other services wrapped around them. DJJS has offered free space to WC at three of the Harbor locations, Henderson, Flamingo, and North Las Vegas. The benefit is to increase traffic at the Harbors and provide wraparound services for the families.

Jaime Cruz, Executive Director, stated that this falls in line with the strategy to find better ways to leverage the resources. Some participants need more resources than WIOA Title I services that the Harbor can provide, such as food, shelter, mental health services, etc. Other entities have asked to partner with WC and offered free space to provide services, including the chambers of commerce and the municipalities. When all are totaled the deferred infrastructure cost amounts to over \$700,000, and many more job seekers and small businesses are served. WC will request three existing service providers that serve the north, south, and central parts of the valley to provide staff at the three Harbor locations Mr. Martin mentioned. WC is excited about this new partnership.

Commissioner Varlin Higbee, Lincoln County, gave kudos to Mr. Martin and WC for thinking outside the box and coming up with this great idea.
