**Re: Income Guidelines — 2024 Lower Living Standard Income Level (LLSIL) and Poverty Guidelines**

In accordance with the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, State Compliance Policy 1.7, DETR is issuing income guidelines effective June 1, 2024, to assist Local Workforce Development Board staff in determining eligibility for low-income individuals.

On January 17, 2024, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services published their poverty guidelines in the Federal Register Vol. 89, No. 11, which were applicable on January 11, 2024. On April 16, 2024, the most recent U.S. Department of Labor LLSIL figures were published in the Federal Register Vol. 89, No. 74.
